

SOCIETY CONDITIONS – 2024

BOOKINGS

- 1. Numbers are not limited but a society with more than 32 players MUST notify the office so that an extended tee reservation may be made.
- 2. A deposit of £100 is required and must be returned with the booking form duly completed and signed. The deposit is non-returnable but will be offset against costs on the day.
- 3. The menu choice should be completed together with the anticipated numbers before the booking form is returned. The Office (01892 890591) should be notified of anticipated numbers at least one week before the visit and the correct numbers 48 hours before, please do not leave messages with either the Pro Shop or the Clubhouse. NB: If the number of guests attending on the day drops below the numbers stated 48 hours prior, then a charge to cover catering lost revenue will be levied.
- 4. Catering after 4.30pm any catering served after 4.30pm in the dining room may attract a supplementary charge if number fall below 16.
- 5. Please note that payment may be made by cash or debit/credit card ONLY and payment of invoice to be made in full on the day.
- 6. Any buggies required should be booked directly through the Pro Shop (01892 890552).

THE CLUB HOUSE

- 1. Your members must use the Visitors' Car Parks which is clearly marked, i.e. the second entrance on the right or overflow left practice area.
- 2. Golf shoes must not be worn in the Lounge.



THE COURSE AND DRESS

- 1. Rules relating to the Practice Ground must be strictly observed.
- 2. All players should be established golfers from a recognised club or society. We insist that players at our Club are aware of our rules and those of the R & A and always adhere to these. Outright beginners will be refused admission to the Course.
- 3. Wide wheeled trolleys only are permitted.
- 4. All players must have their own bag and clubs.
- 5. Proper golf clothing must be worn. Please see the enclosed Dress Rules with reference to both the Course and the Clubhouse. Any infringement of the Dress Rules will be referred to the society organiser.

LAMBERHURST GOLF CLUB

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COURSE, PRACTICE AREAS, PATIO & SPIKE BAR

All members, visitors and guests are required to wear correct formal golf attire. Clothes must be worn in a proper manner. On the course and practice areas shirts must be tucked-in (except ladies' shirts with specially tailored waists); socks must be worn with shorts; shorts/skirts should be tailored and cut close to the knee.

The following are not permitted: T-shirts; shirts without collars (except mock collars); shirts cut above waist level; beach or elasticated shorts; tracksuits or similar; trousers tucked into socks; caps back to front; any other form of dress deemed to be inappropriate. No head gear in the Spike Bar. Jeans are allowed in the Spike Bar and Patio but not on the course, practice areas or lounge bar and dining room.

LOUNGE BAR & DINING ROOM

Standard - 'Smart-casual' dress and appearance as a minimum.

The following are not permitted at any time: Golf Shoes; wet or soiled clothing; hats or caps; any clothing not allowed on the course, practice area, patio and spike bar; other inappropriate forms of dress. **Jeans are not allowed in lounge bar and dining room.**

Jacket & Tie must be worn by men for representative matches and any other events specified by the Captain.

Exceptions may be made for Dining & Social visitors.

Club staff have been authorised to ensure that the rules are followed and will refuse service to anyone not complying with the Code, but it is the responsibility of all members and visitors to comply with the detail and the spirit of the rules and to ensure that other Members and Guests do so as well.

MOBILE PHONE POLICY

The Club recommends that mobile phones be carried on the course for emergency purposes. They must be kept switched off other than during an emergency. For emergency calls quote TN3 8DT.

Mobile phones may be used in the Club spike bar, Changing Rooms and Patio area, but they MUST be kept on SILENT. Use of phones for purposes other than calls is allowed in the Club lounge.

Should people wish to respond to, or make, a voice call they must retire to the spike bar, changing rooms or patio.

The Club requests that due respect is given to fellow members and guests. Phone usage not in accordance with this policy will be considered a breach of Club bye-laws.
